

# **JOB DESCRIPTION FOR THE LOCAL CHURCH MUSIC AND WORSHIP LEADER**

## **Preamble**

1. Commitment
2. Work closely with the pastoral team in achieving specifications
3. Have a positive philosophy of religion, namely a biblical understanding of the subject
4. Encourage the participation of all to worship (assembly, visitors, church officers, artists ...)

## **A. Spiritual Profile**

1. Spiritual experience with Jesus Christ
2. Spirit of evangelism
3. Active participation in the Church spiritual edification
4. Concern for unity.

## **B. Musical Competence**

1. Be able to design quality programs for:
  - Worship services - Communion Services - Baptisms – Weeks of Prayer - Christmas
  - Easter - Concerts – Visitors’ Sabbath – Youth – Etc.

## **C. Profile of animation**

1. Know how to give a chance to everyone
2. Gatherer
3. Find collaborators, know how to delegate
4. Have an open mind, promote pluralism of ideas.

## **D. Achievements**

1. Actively involved with the pastoral team to:
  - the Annual Calendar preparation of the various religious services
  - the elaboration development of the weekly worship order or special services
  - the proposition of selection of music and if necessary, the selection of officers during the service.
2. Ensure that the preparation of a worship service is designed and sufficiently completed in advance to avoid last minute improvisation.
3. Inform all the participants in the worship service (instrumentalists, singers, song leader, reciters, technical services, and diaconate) on the content and the presentation of the program.
4. Develop a long-term worship vision (monthly or quarterly).
5. Encourage the participation of all generations in the Church liturgical life.
6. Encourage the creation of different groups of musical expression and integrate them into the life of the Church (worship service and cultural events).
7. Ensure that there is constant progress in the group qualification.
8. Educationally and spiritually advise any group in the community in terms of its participation in worship.
